About the Student Publication Prize

The Brown and Percy *Journal on Developmental Disabilities* Student Publication Prize... is intended to... "encourage student contribution to the journal." The prize will be awarded to an author of what is judged to be the most outstanding student contribution published in a calendar year. A student contribution is deemed to be a paper that has been successfully peer-reviewed and published in the *Journal on Developmental Disabilities* based on research or ideas of someone who is currently a student, or of someone reporting work completed while he or she was a student (e.g., a thesis).

Normally, an eligible author for this award would be the first author of the paper though exceptions are made. The prize carries a cash value of \$500 in Canadian funds, and is awarded with a plaque and letter of notification about the honour. When two individuals tie for first place, the cash award is split and two plaques are awarded. In the case of a runner-up, the recipient receives a letter of notification about the honour.
