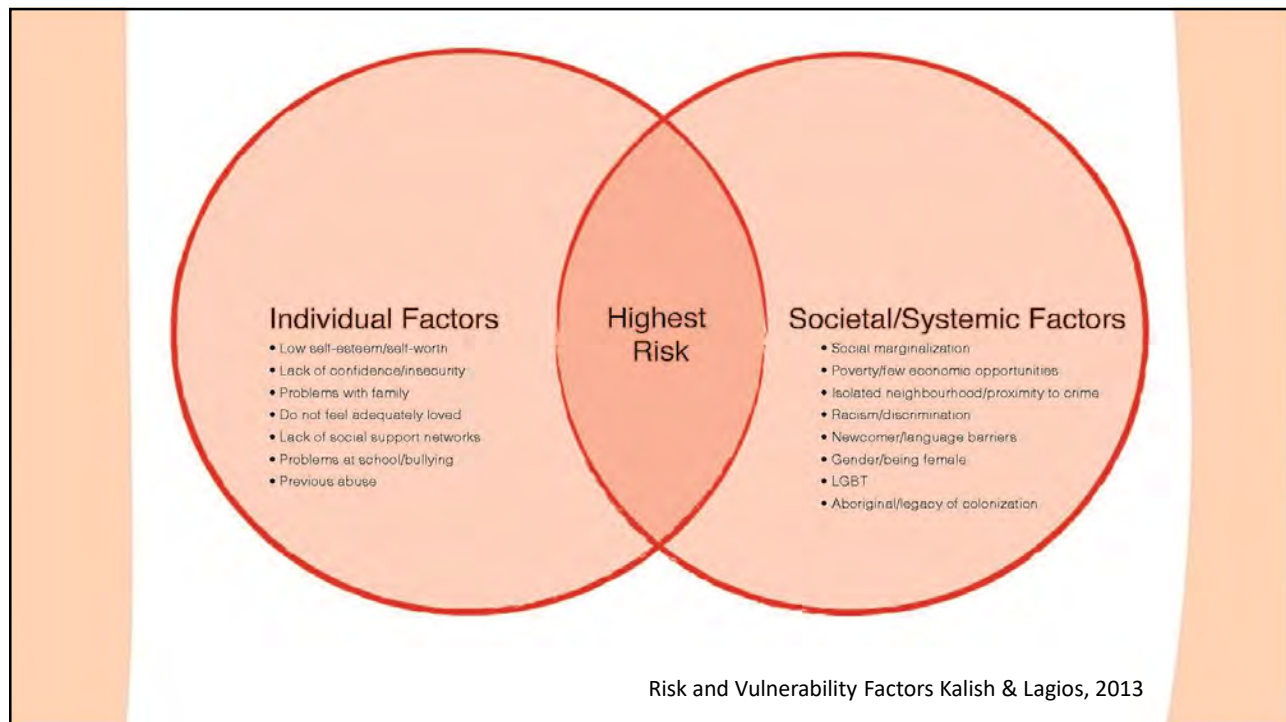

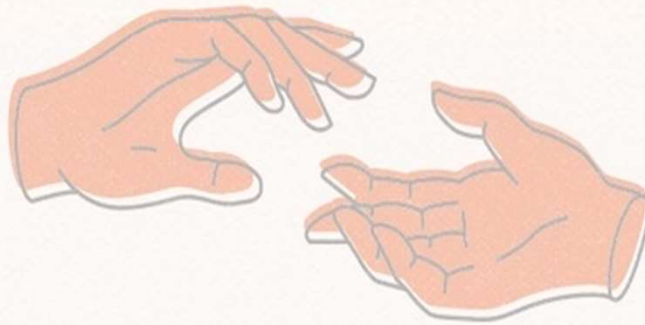




Pimp's Mindset

Domestic Human Trafficking support at Montage



Montage has over 25 years of experience in providing residential and person-directed planning (PDP) services to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), including survivors of domestic human trafficking. Montage has leveraged and built upon its current service model to better meet the needs of survivors of human trafficking with a trauma-informed lens.

Montage developed pillars of support that meets the Ministry's priorities in that it is survivor-led and informed. The Domestic Human Trafficking team, supports youths and adults (16+) who have been exploited through human trafficking and have an intellectual developmental disability (IDD).



The Pillars of support are:

- Person Directed Planning (PDP)
- Supporting community Partnerships
- Supported Employment
- Raising awareness
- Survivor engaged-peer support



Person Directed Planning (PDP)

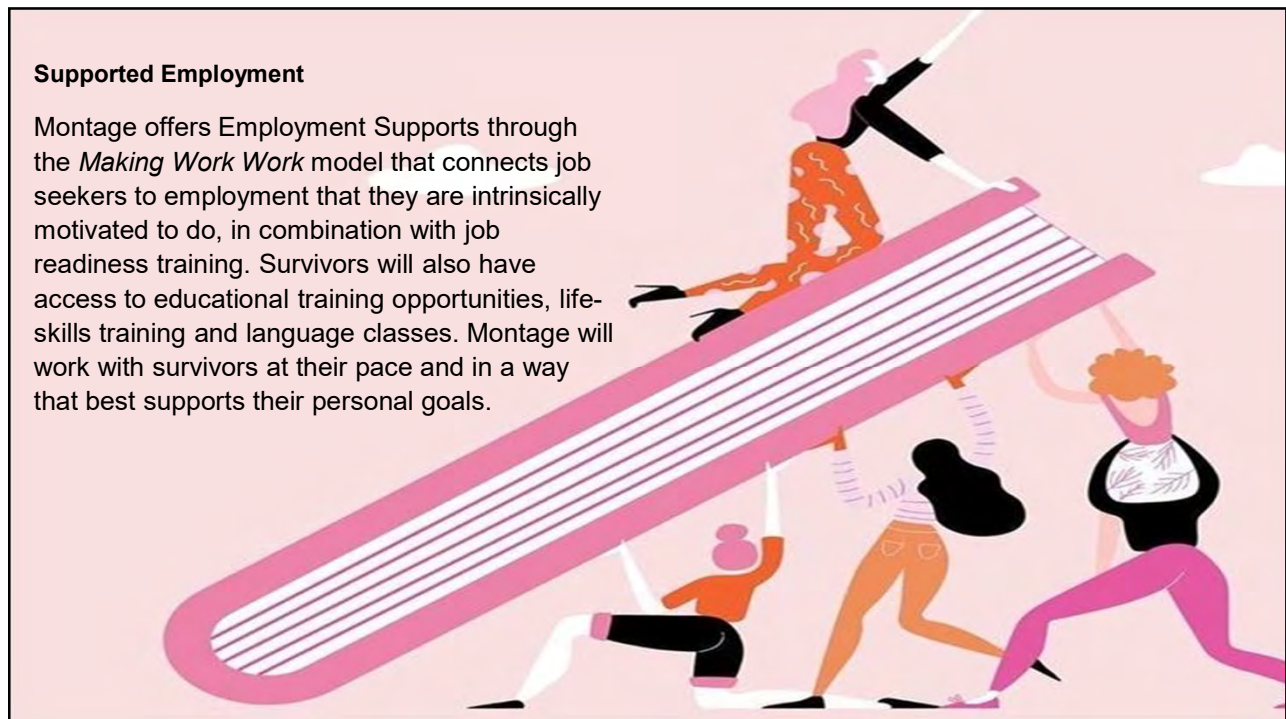
Every survivor is connected to and supported by one of Montage's Person-Directed Planners, who will serve as a single point of contact for the survivor throughout the duration of their time with Montage. Survivors will be the architects of their own service delivery models and will work with their planners to develop time-specific and person-driven goals, establish a support structure and access community supports in a way that works for them.





Supporting community Partnerships

Montage has connected survivors of human trafficking with essential services such as trauma-informed counseling, mental health and addiction support, legal/court services and much more. By building a strong partnership and expanding the existing network with new partners, such as Advocates Against Abuse, Montage is able to reach more survivors with IDD who are in need of services.



Supported Employment

Montage offers Employment Supports through the *Making Work Work* model that connects job seekers to employment that they are intrinsically motivated to do, in combination with job readiness training. Survivors will also have access to educational training opportunities, life-skills training and language classes. Montage will work with survivors at their pace and in a way that best supports their personal goals.

Raising Awareness

Montage developed training resources and trauma-informed service delivery models that are applied across all its service areas. Montage aims to be able to deliver training to other organizations across the broader developmental services sector based on lessons learned and best practices. Additionally, Montage will raise awareness of issues impacting this group through social media campaigns, annual reports, collecting data and sector-wide conferences.



Survivor Engaged-Peer Support

Montage currently serves survivors of Domestic Human Trafficking who have agreed to participate in the design and implementation of this project and provide peer support services to new survivors. Peer support workers will meet with survivors to provide guidance, answer questions, facilitate support meetings, and share resources on exiting the sex trade.

Montage will hire 2 survivors with IDD: one individual to design and develop project materials and the other to act as the Training Developer and Facilitator. Including individuals with lived experiences on the core project team will result in approaches that are implementable, impactful, and respectful of the healing process required to achieve the proposed outcomes.
